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ACTION VERBS & STATIVE VERBS

All verbs in English are classified as either stative or action verbs (also referred to as 'dynamic verbs'). Action verbs describe actions we take (things we do) or things that happen. Stative verbs refer to the way things 'are' - their appearance, state of being, smell, etc. The most important difference between stative and action verbs is that action verbs can be used in continuous tenses and stative verbs cannot be used in continuous tenses.

Action verbs	Stative verbs
- She's studying math with Tom at the moment.	- The flowers smell lovely.
AND She studies math with Tom every Friday.	NOT Those flowers are smelling lovely.
- They've been working since seven o'clock this	- She heard him speak in Seattle yesterday
morning.	afternoon.
AND They worked for two hours yesterday afternoon.	NOT She was hearing him speak in Seattle yesterday
- We'll be having a meeting when you arrive.	afternoon.
AND We are going to meet next Friday.	- They'll love the concert tomorrow evening.
	NOT They'll be loving the concert tomorrow evening.
